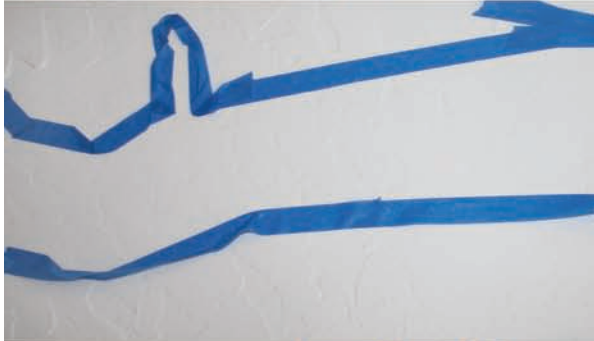

Painted Tree Instructions & Stencils



PROJECT LIST

Masking Tape

Paint

(I used Behr's Revival Mahogany/BROWN, Corn Husk Green/GREEN, Frosted Pomegranate/RED and a general white/)

Paint brush or stencil brush

STEP 1

Use the masking tape to outline your tree trunk. Be sure and look at it from a distance AND up close.

STEP 2

Paint the inside of the masked off area brown. Peel away the tape and touch up the edges.

STEP 3

Cut out the leaf stencil. Use a stencil brush to create leaves on the branches. More your way around the tree being sure not to stencil over wet leaves. Going back to fill in more leaves may take 2-3 paintings.

STEP 4

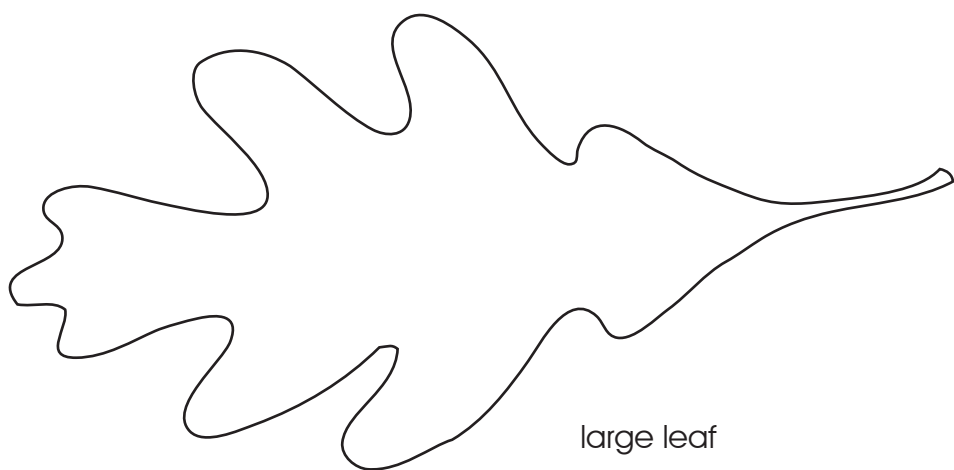
Stencil on the flowers (mine are in white). Because of the pink background I chose to free hand a red outline on each of the flowers. Once the flowers were dried, stencil on the flower centers.

STEP 5

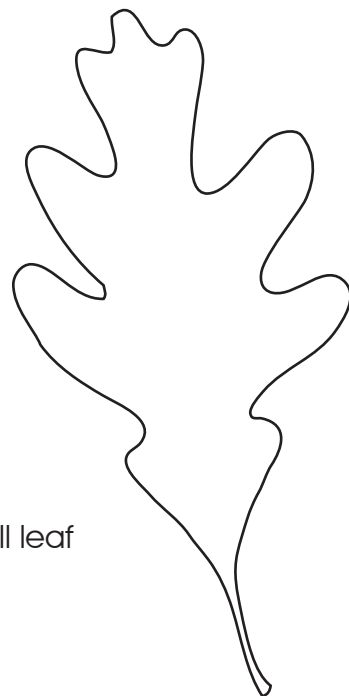
Let everything dry. Add vinyl birds or framed birds to complete.

Painted Tree Stencils

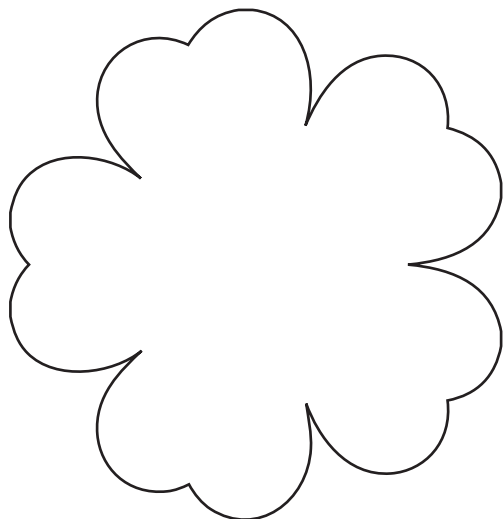

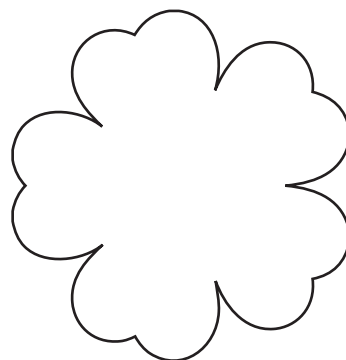
large leaf



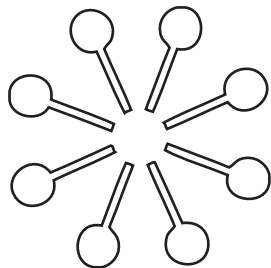
small leaf



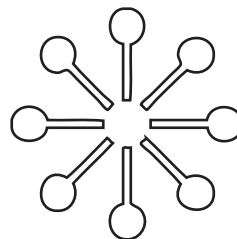
large flower
